Henriette Diaz DeLille

Henriette DeLille, SSF (March 11, 1813-November 16, 1862) was a Louisiana Creole of color and Catholic nun from New Orleans. Her father was a white man from France, her mother was a “quadroon”, and her grandfather came from Spain. She founded the Sisters of the Holy Family in 1836 and served as their first Mother Superior.

Henriette and her family lived in the French Quarter, not far from St. Louis Cathedral. Trained by her mother in French literature, music, and dancing, Henriette was groomed to find a white, wealthy male partner in the placage system, which was a type of common-law marriage. Her mother also taught her nursing skills and how to prepare medicines from herbs. Raised Catholic in the French tradition, Henriette was drawn to a strong religious belief in the Catholic Church’s teaching rather than the life her mother suggested. She became an outspoken critic of the placage system. She believed the system was a violation of the Church’s teachings on the sacrament of marriage. She was influenced by Sister Mathe Fontier, who had opened a school for girls of color. In 1827, at the age of 14, Henriette began teaching at the local Catholic high school. She was dedicated to teaching the poor, which came into direct conflict with her mother. In 1835 her mother suffered a breakdown and was legally declared incompetent. Delille was granted control of her funds. After seeing to her mother’s needs, she used the remaining resources to begin a small community of women who cared for the poor and sick. She opened the first Catholic home for the elderly in America. She often secretly orchestrated the baptism of children of color in St. Louis Cathedral. There is a shrine at the entrance of the cathedral recognizing her zeal for the faith and her extraordinary courage rooted in holiness and grace.

In 2010, Pope Benedict XVI declared her “Venerable”, the stage of the canonization process before beatification and sainthood.

Communion from the cup

We have begun to serve Communion from the cup at the 8:00 mass. In the month of April, we hope to begin serving the cup at Saturday 4:00 and Sunday 10:00 masses as well. The following is a reminder on how to receive from the cup: after receiving the host, approach the Eucharist Minister serving the cup, simply bow before the Eucharist, the Minister will say, "The Blood of Christ", you answer, "Amen", the minister will hand you the cup with the precious Blood, you take a small sip, return the cup to the Minister, bow once again and return to your place in church. The person receiving from the cup should never dip the host in the cup, but simply take a small sip. If you are uncomfortable with drinking from the cup because of the possibility of spreading illness, then please do not drink from the cup. The same goes for if you are not feeling well or may have a cold or something more serious, then please do not drink from the cup. Even though the Body and Blood of Jesus is present in the host itself, it is still a wondrous gift to once again "partake of the cup".

The Way of the Cross will be celebrated on Fridays of Lent (except Good Friday) after 5:30pm Mass.

Fourth Sunday of Lent Saint Paul gives us a wakeup call. As stewards of the light of Christ, we are to reflect that light with the help of the Holy Spirit. If Christ's work has transformed and illuminated our lives, there should be a change. The light of Christ's active presence should be at work in us. And as the light shines within us, we take on the properties of that light and we shine too. We are used by God to shine the light of Christ in the lives of others. A challenging Lenten reflection: Is the light of Christ shining in our hearts? Is the light of Christ reflecting out from us to others?
