Charlene Marie Richard

Charlene Marie Richard (January 13, 1947-August 11, 1959) was a twelve-year-old Roman Catholic girl from Richard, Louisiana. She was the second oldest of ten children born to Joseph Elvin and Mary Alice Richard. Adults and children who knew her considered her to be smart but otherwise unremarkable. She was a devout Catholic but no more so than was customary in the local Cajun community. Richard's mother said, "She liked sports and was always busy with something. She went to church and said her rosary, but she was just a normal little girl". In May 1959, after reading a book about Therese of Lisieux, Charlene asked her grandmother whether she, too, might become a saint by praying like Therese.

After concerns of her health arose, her mother took her to a physician. As a result, only two weeks before her death she was diagnosed with acute lymphatic leukemia and hospitalized at Our Lady of Lourdes Hospital. Though the illness was painful, she remained cheerful, meekly accepted her fate, and offered her suffering to God. While dying, Charlene prayed for other individuals to be healed or to be converted to Catholicism. She died on August 11, 1959 and was buried at St. Edward's Church in Richard, Louisiana.

In January 2020, Bishop J. Douglas Deshotel of the Diocese of Lafayette officially opened the cause of her sainthood and respectfully declared her "Servant of God", further advancing her cause toward beatification and sainthood.

We will once again serve Communion from the cup. We will start at the 8:00mass, beginning in March. In the month of May, we hope to begin serving the cup at Saturday 4:00 and Sunday 10:00 masses as well. The following is a reminder on how to receive from the cup: after receiving the host, approach the Eucharist Minister serving the cup, simply bow before the Eucharist, the Minister will say, "The Blood of Christ", you answer, "Amen", the minister will hand you the cup with the precious Blood, you take a small sip, return the cup to the Minister, bow once again and return to your place in church. The person receiving from the cup should never dip the host in the cup, but simply take a small sip. If you are uncomfortable with drinking from the cup because of the possibility of spreading illness, then please do not drink from the cup. The same goes for if you are not feeling well or may have a cold or something more serious, then please do not drink from the cup. Even though the Body and Blood of Jesus is present in the host itself, it is still a wondrous gift to once again "partake of the cup".
