**Auguste ‘Nonco’ Pelafique**

On January 10, 1888, Auguste Robert ‘Nonco’ Pelafique was born in Beaucins, France, approximately twelve miles from Lourdes in the High Pyrenees. His deep-rooted faith could be attributed to his parents’ frequent Sunday pilgrimage to Lourdes. Later in life, Auguste was nicknamed ‘Nonco’ which comes from two words: the French word for uncle which is ‘Nonc’ and the first syllable of his name which is pronounced ‘O’. It was an appropriate name because he was considered everybody’s uncle.

In 1889 Nonco was only one year old when he and his family immigrated to the United States and moved to Arnaudville, Louisiana. He studied to become a teacher by attending the State Normal School in Natchitoches, LA. It was here where he first joined the Apostleship of Prayer League of the Sacred Heart.

Eventually returning to Arnaudville, he became well known for his tremendous piety and devotion to the Sacred Heart of Jesus. He became the only male teacher to work with Marianite Sisters of the Holy Cross at the Little Flower School in Arnaudville. He wrote, produced and directed singing pageants and religious plays and devotions to the Sacred Heart of Jesus, Christmas, Lent and Feasts of the Blessed Mother. A daily communicant, he went on foot to visit the fallen away and invited everyone to prayer and devotion to the Sacred Heart of Jesus.

In January 2020, Bishop J. Douglas Deshotel of the Diocese of Lafayette officially opened the cause of his sainthood and respectfully declared him “Servant of God”, further advancing his cause toward beatification and sainthood.

Communion from the cup

We will once again serve Communion from the cup. We will start at the 8:00mass, beginning in March. In the month of May, we hope to begin serving the cup at Saturday 4:00 and Sunday 10:00 masses as well. The following is a reminder on how to receive from the cup: after receiving the host, approach the Eucharist Minister serving the cup, simply bow before the Eucharist, the Minister will say, "The Blood of Christ", you answer, "Amen", the minister will hand you the cup with the precious Blood, you take a small sip, return the cup to the Minister, bow once again and return to your place in church. The person receiving from the cup should never dip the host in the cup, but simply take a small sip. If you are uncomfortable with drinking from the cup because of the possibility of spreading illness, then please do not drink from the cup. The same goes for if you are not feeling well or may have a cold or something more serious, then please do not drink from the cup. Even though the Body and Blood of Jesus is present in the host itself, it is still a wondrous gift to once again "partake of the cup".
