#### The Epiphany of the Lord

The Gospel reading reveals the journey, the visit and the gifts of the Magi. They read the stars and inspired by their own wisdom and vision they truly want to find and pay homage to Christ Jesus who they understood would bring about a kingdom of justice and peace. Although they are not astrologers like the Magi, good stewards go about the task of reading the signs of the time as well. Moreover, they help others discover the loving presence of Christ through their own actions, bringing mercy, compassion and hope for a better world. How do you live each day to bring about a better world, a better life, unity with those who gather around the Eucharistic table and a deeper communion with God?

# THE EPIPHANY OF THE LORD

God invites all creation to move away from the cold and bitter darkness and seek warmth from His brilliant and radiant light. Even though we are invited and sometimes do not accept the gift, we are always issued that same wondrous invitation to follow the star that leads to Him. The Father draws creation to Himself to be with Him. He sends Jesus as the invitation. Jesus who is enfleshed in our very being, the Word incarnate, nudges us with love and grace to the Father. The love that the Father has for the Son that bears the name of the Holy Spirit, inspires us to say a resounding 'yes' to the invitation.

The Epiphany is about the great theophany of the shining star that leads the Magi to the newborn king. It is through that star that the Father breaks through time and history to reveal Himself in the star and lead us all to His Son. The Son in turn leads us to the Father. We are caught up in this dance of the love of the Father-Son-Holy Spirit God who wants us to join the dance.

The light brings warmth and comfort, but it also challenges us to move away from the darkness. It is the darkness that tells us we are forgotten, we are not loveable, we are despised and rejected. The brilliance of the light calls us to the Father's heart, the home of who we are. The Father's heart is the center of us, our purpose, our goal. It is He who defines us and lifts us to Himself. We are His. Jesus reminds us of this constantly.

The three Magi bring gifts to honor the Christ-child, but also to help us understand who Jesus is. He is priest, prophet and king. As priest He is given the frankincense of worship to lift our prayers and hopes to the Father. As king He is given the gold to rule His kingdom of justice, peace and love, challenging us to love God and our neighbor. As prophet He is anointed with the myrrh to bring the sacred aroma of life in the midst of death, to lead us to resurrection and the fullest expression of the Father's love. As any prophet Jesus reminds us of our covenant with the Father; we are His people and He is our God. We belong to Him, even after death – especially after death. Now that all the busy-ness of the holidays seems to shift a bit we are afforded the opportunity to look again at the creche. There is a Holy Family; a father of humility, a mother full of grace and a son of promise. There are shepherds from the fields with their sheep to see the Lord of their longing. There are three Magi to see the newborn king. There is a man who leads the unseated camel, almost as if to invite us to jump on up and take the journey with all those gathered there. And there is a donkey at rest, because one day one like him will carry this child of promise into Jerusalem amidst fanfare and raised palms – leading Him to His death and resurrection. This is where the star of Bethlehem leads us; to this sacred place of holiness and grace, where we come to meet God and others.



Epiphany is about us, about how we become the shining star of God's love in the lives of others. It's about how we bring gifts of gold, frankincense and myrrh to others along the way, affirming them in their journey of faith. They too are priests, prophets and kings leading us to the Father.

Epiphany is about the Father. It is about His profound love for a creation He breathed into life that keeps forgetting who it is and keeps

getting lost in darkness. It is loved. It is redeemed. It is filled with grace and light. The skies are bright with God's love.
