Divine Care on The Camino

Summer 2024

**Pilgrimage Walk of the
Camino de Santiago in Spain**

Dear Assumption Church,

This summer, I was blessed with the opportunity to go on a pilgrimage to walk the Camino de Santiago in Spain. Beginning July 15, I walked 119 miles over ten days along the Camino Frances route with three other Tulane students, a missionary, and Tulane's campus minister. Each day consisted of at least five hours of walking, Mass, and an hour dedicated to prayer. On July 24, we finally arrived at the Cathedral of Santiago de Compostela, where the relics of St. James the Apostle are enshrined. On July 25, we joined hundreds of pilgrims to celebrate mass for the Feast of St. James at the cathedral. In this experience, God revealed so much about myself and His love for me. I want to share a central theme of our pilgrimage: trust in the Lord.

Throughout the journey, God blessed us tremendously and rained down signal graces to remind us of His love and care. For instance, a girl in our group named Katherine celebrated her birthday on one of our longest walking days. Katherine was upset about being away from her family on her birthday, so we prayed that God would give her a gift. Late in the afternoon, the sun be at down on us. We had not stumbled upon a town in over an hour. Tired and thirsty, we rounded a corner and saw a small house with a fence and a sign that read "hospitality" in a dozen languages. We approached the home and found a cooler with cold water and juices, a table with pastries and snacks, and a small barrel with wine. We were filled with joy and recognized that this was Katherine's present from God.

God strengthened us and showed us that He was always beside us. Our second day of walking took us through a set of steep mountains. At first, we struggled to climb through switchbacks and rocky terrain. After an hour, we reached a clearing and saw the sun rising over the mountains. The ascent continued, but the beauty of the next stretch of the path invigorated us. Wildflowers decorated the path, and rolling hills stretched as far as we could see over the Spanish countryside.

We finally reached the top of the mountain in a town called O Cebreiro. Around the year 1300, a Eucharistic miracle took place in this town at the Church of Santa Maria la Real. During the consecration, the host turned into flesh and bled on the altar. The chalice and paten used when the miracle occurred still sit in that church today. As we walked up to the church, another group of pilgrims greeted us at the door and told us that a priest in their group would be celebrating mass in the next five minutes in English. We had arrived just in time.

The priest walked out wearing blue vestments, and we were surprised to learn that it was the Memorial of Our Lady of Mount Carmel. As the priest read the Collect, our group meditated as the words spoke directly to our experience that day:

*May the venerable intercession of the glorious Virgin Mary
come to our aid, we pray, O Lord,
so that, fortified by her protection,
we may reach the mountain which is Christ.
Who lives and reigns with you in the unity of the Holy Spirit,
God, for ever and ever.*

While we suffered, Mary walked with us up the mountain. She brought us to the mountain's summit where we received the Eucharist, the source and summit of our faith, at the site where a Eucharistic miracle occurred.

In the Sermon on the Mount, Jesus tells us, "Your Father knows what you need before you ask him" (Matthew 6:8b). With birthday presents, sunrises, flower fields, scenic views, Mary's intercession, the Eucharist, and more, God provided exactly what we needed all the way to Santiago de Compostela. God knows all of us so well and gives abundantly, but too often, we need to be reminded that we can trust Him. I hope to be more attentive to all the graces God grants me so I can offer more praise and gratitude in return.

This pilgrimage has been one of the most incredible experiences of my life, and I thank Assumption Church for your prayers. Please know I prayed for our community and am grateful for your support. Thank you for enabling me to grow in my faith and enabling me to share my faith with others.
